Background to the chapter

The first-century apostle Paul preaches in Thessalonica, Berea and Athens, cities in Greece.

He tells them about the promised special person, whom the Jews called the Christ.

1 to 3	What did Paul tell his hearers in Thessalonica?	He told his hearers that Jesus was "the Christ" – the special person who suffered, died and was raised from the dead.
4 to 9	2. How did some Jews react?	Some Jews didn't like the message and stirred up trouble.
10 to 12	3. What was notable about the Jews at Beroea (Berea)?	Jews at Beroea (Berea) checked that the *Scriptures supported Paul's message. * the Old Testament
13	4. How did some Jews react?	The Jews again caused trouble.
14 to 21	5. What happened when Paul went to Athens? Text note: The Areopagus was a court in Athens used for public debate and holding trials.	Paul preached at Athens and was invited to give his message at the Areopagus.
22 to 26	6. What did Paul tell the Athenians about God?	He told them that the living God made and sustained all life.

27 to 30	7. What did Paul say they should do?	They needed to seek him and find him and then repent.
31 to 34	8. What did he tell them God's plans were for the world?	A day has been set for the world to be judged by God's special promised person. He has confirmed his appointment of Jesus by raising him from the dead.

Verse(s)	Main point(s)
2 Chronicles 30 v 9	Hezekiah told the Israelites that God would be gracious and merciful if they turned to him.
Psalm 9 v 10	God will not forsake those who seek and trust him.
Psalm 53 v 2	God is looking for those who will seek Him.
Isaiah 55 v 6 and 7	If we seek the LORD by forsaking ungodly ways, he will have mercy and forgive us.
Hebrews 11 v 6	God rewards those who believe him and seek him.
