14 & 15	3. How does Paul encourage Timothy (and us) to remain faithful in a godless world?	He encourages him to hold on to what he has learned from the Holy Scriptures.
16 & 17	4. Why does Paul say we should read the Scriptures?	He tells Timothy that the Scriptures help us learn about salvation through faith in Jesus.

Verse(s)	Main point(s)
John 20 v 31	John says he has written so that others may believe in Jesus and so have life.
Acts 15 v 11	Peter tells his fellow believers that we are saved through the grace (undeserved favour) of Jesus Christ.
Romans 10 v 9	We must believe that God raised Jesus from the dead.
Galatians 3 v 26 to 28	Baptism is part of expressing our faith in Jesus Christ.
1 John 3 v 23	Belief in Jesus involves obeying him and showing love to others.
