	Paul and Barnabas preach in Iconium. They continue to preach despite opposition from the Jews.
1.	What did the Jews from Antioch and Iconium persuade the crowds at Lystra to do to Paul?
2.	On their return, what did the apostles do for each of the churches at Lystra, Iconium and Antioch?
3.	Where are the cities of Derbe, Iconium, Lystra and Antioch? Use the map at the end to find out.

Day 2

Acts 15	
	Some believing Pharisees insist that believers must keep the law of Moses. This conflict between Jewish and Gentile believers is resolved.
1.	When Jews came to Antioch saying that Gentile Christians needed to be circumcised, what action did the church take to decide the issue?
2.	How did Peter say that both Jews and non-Jews will be saved?
3.	What were the proposed four recommendations that James made for the Gentiles?

Day 3

Acts 16	
	Paul and Silas go to preach in Philippi. Lydia and her household are baptised. A jailer and his household are baptised after Paul and Silas end up in his prison.
1.	What did Lydia say to the apostles after she was baptised?
2.	Why did the masters of the fortune telling girl drag Paul and Silas to the authorities?
3.	What did the jailer and his family do after Paul and Silas had preached God's word to them?



Day 4

Acts 18	
	Paul preaches in Corinth. He stays in Corinth for 18 months and then goes back to base in Antioch via Ephesus and Jerusalem.
1.	What did Paul do in Corinth every Sabbath?
2.	Paul stopped teaching the Jews in Corinth and then focused on Gentiles. What made him do this?
3.	What was notable about Apollos?

Day 5

Acts 19	
	Paul preaches in Ephesus. Books on magical arts are burnt when their owners become believers. Paul then causes a riot when his preaching upsets the local silversmiths.
1.	What did Paul preach for three months in the Ephesian synagogue?
2.	What did they call the Christians' beliefs in Ephesus at that time?
3.	What had Paul persuaded people throughout Asia that so upset the Ephesian silversmiths?

Day 6

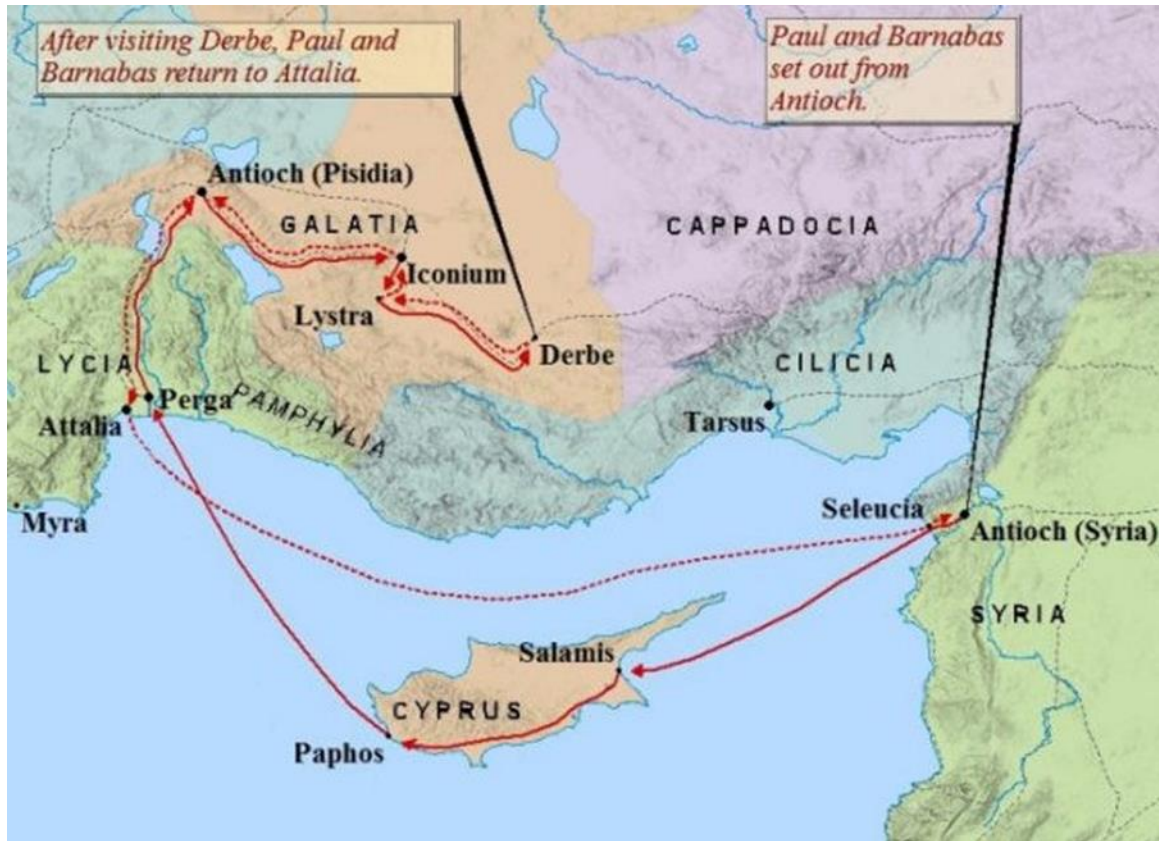
Acts 20
